- **1. Introductions:** All in attendance are listed above.

### 3. Construction General Permit (CGP) Resources and Feedback:

- Deb Loiselle presented on the new CGP.
- This is currently under MCM #1 under Developers Resources.
- This will move when the new website is live.
- This is not part of the MS4 permit requirements but there is a lot of overlap in information and requirements.
- NHDES is not the permitting authority for the CGP, but we are here to help. The EPA contact is Michelle Vuto her email is Vuto.Michelle@epa.gov.
- There is a link to the permit on the MS4 Blog that brings you to the EPA site. There is a lot of information on this site.
- The <u>CGP FAQ document</u> is well organized with a lot of good information. Key things of interest include:
- This is for land disturbance of one acre or greater- this does not include maintenance.
- NOI coverage is on pages 12/13.
- Turbidity monitoring guidance is on page 28.
- Reporting relative to monitoring is on page 29.
- Certification process for qualified inspectors is new. Inspectors have a year to get certified. If
  you are working under an existing NOI you need to follow those requirements, for that you
  need to be qualified but not certified.
- There will be a free training for certification coming this summer. It will be an online course with an exam.
- You will need to get an 80% on the exam to pass but can take the exam more than once.

- Another option is through non-EPA trainings that are listed in the FAQ document. These can be costly, \$500-\$600. These options are vetted by EPA but they don't recommend one over another.
- You do not need to be certified for the MS4 permit requirement.

- We will go through the Appendix F & H requirements next month.
- System Vulnerability Factors- Gretchen, Jamie, and others will write up a blurb to go along with the spreadsheet.
- This spreadsheet will be posted on the MS4 Blog soon.
- This requirements table might look long, but some of the requirements just involve tracking.
- Track site reviews and inspections for your annual report.
- Assess street design and parking lot guidelines and other requirements in terms of creation of impervious cover. Next month we will have a document to help with this requirement.
- Assess regulations on zoning and construction codes to make certain green infrastructure practices are allowable. Next month we will have a document to help with this requirement.
- Inventory and priority ranking of permittee owned property for retrofit.
- Report total number of catch basins, number inspected, cleaned, etc. on your annual report.
- Report metrics for street sweeping on your annual report.
- Training for employees for SW/SWPPP activities.
- Report findings for municipal site inspections that are exposed to SW.
- Record BMP modifications on your annual report.
- Document water quality monitoring results.
- Document any studies conducted during the reporting period.
- Q- Are these studies done during the permit or because of the permit?
  - A- Tom will investigate this.
- Q- Do we have to report all BMPs?
  - o A-No, just the BMPs you installed because of the permit.
- Please let Deb, Tom, and/or Gretchen know if you need assistance or just to check in.
